About the Interface Kit

The Stratus ES/ESG interface kit provides easy connection and disconnection from a Stratus 1S, 2, 2S, or 3 portable receiver to Stratus ES/ESG. The receiver then receives auxiliary power from the transponder and also receives the ADS-B and GPS signal from the transponder's externally-mounted antennas.

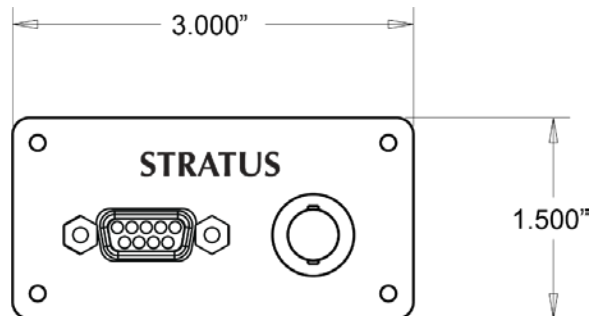

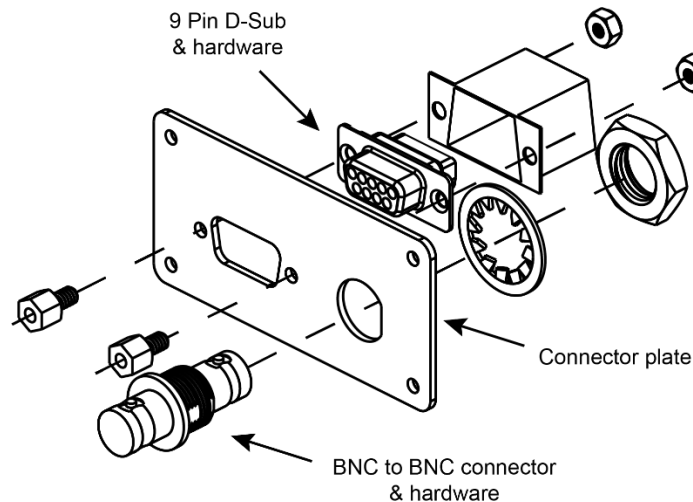
CAUTION: Make sure that aircraft power is disconnected before connecting any cabling.

Installing the connector plate

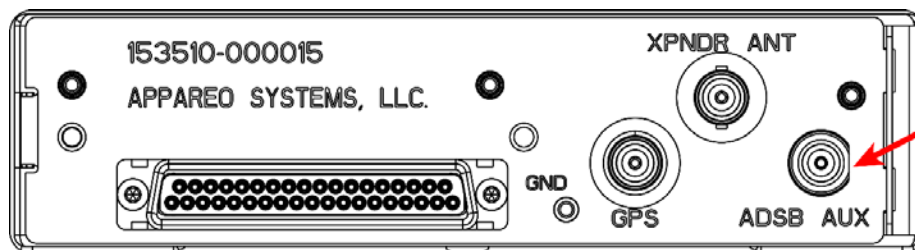
1. Find a connector plate mounting location. The connector plate measures approximately 1.5" x 3" and can be secured in any orientation anywhere in the cockpit.



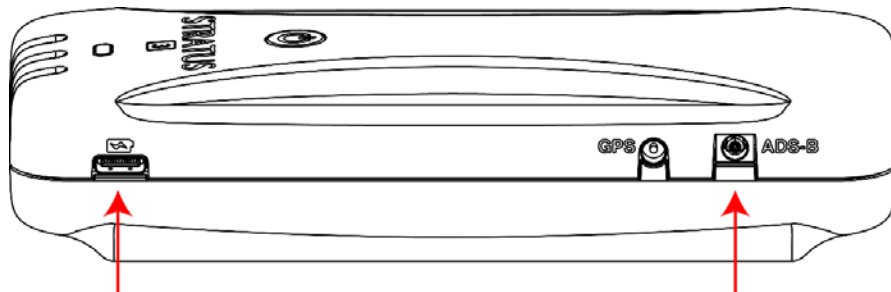
2. Orient the connector plate so that one of the Stratus logos is visible and readable. Mount the 9-Pin D-Sub and BNC to BNC connector (251015-000089) onto the connector plate, as shown in the diagram below.



3. Install the BNC connector (251015-000078) in the ADSB AUX hole on the transponder backplate.



4. Wire the connector plate to the transponder following the wiring diagram on page 6 or 7 and using the cabling specified under *Additional Components* on page 3.
5. Plug the D-Sub cable into the connector plate 9-pin D-Sub connector. Secure using the thumb screws.
6. Plug the BNC cable into the connector plate BNC adapter.
7. Connect the remaining end of the power serial cable into the power port of the receiver, and the remaining end of the RF interface cable into the ADS-B port of the receiver. Secure cables as necessary.



Configuring the transponder

After the interface kit has been installed, configure the transponder to allow for ADS-B In receiver information.

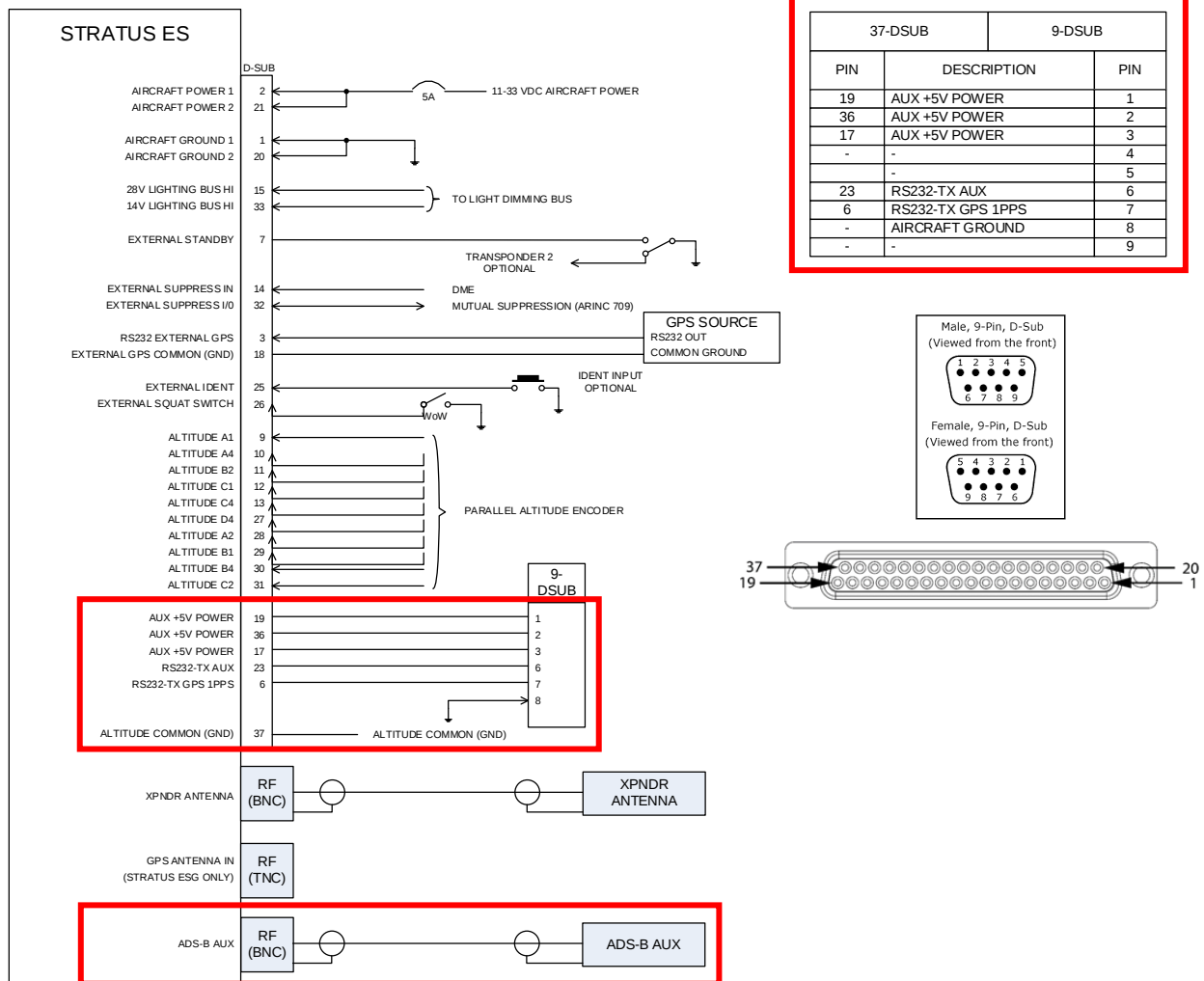
1. Enter into configuration mode on the transponder.
*To enter into configuration mode: While holding the **FUNC** key, press and release the **PWR** key.*
2. Press **FUNC** or the arrow keys to navigate to the **ADS-B In Capability** screen. Press **ENT**.
3. Use the arrow keys to select the frequency associated with your receiver. Press **ENT**.

Receiver	Frequency
Stratus 1S	UAT
Stratus 2, 2S, or 3	UAT and 1090 ES

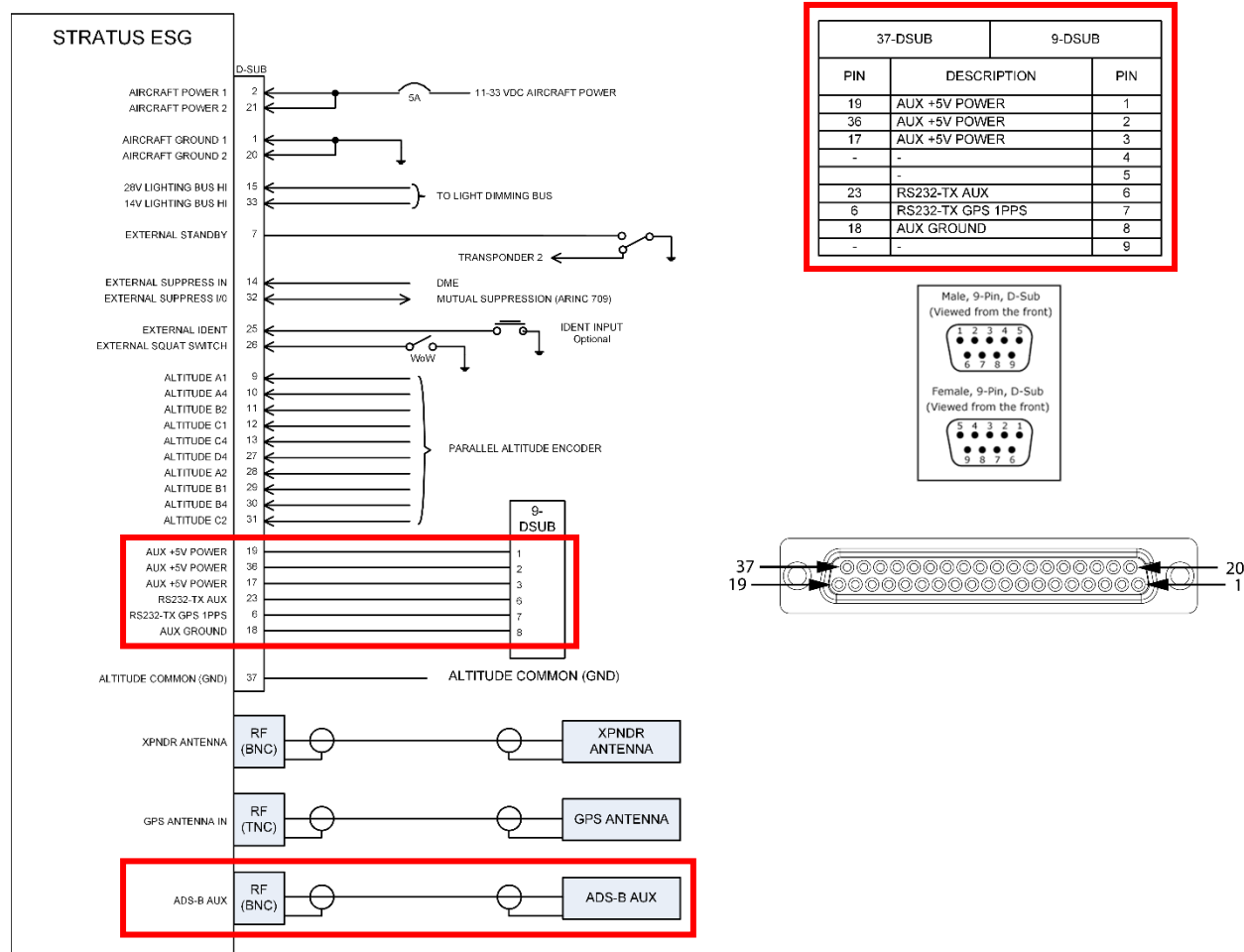
Automatically turning on the receiver

You can configure the receiver to automatically turn on when the transponder is powered on. To enable this, navigate to the Stratus Status page of ForeFlight Mobile or the settings page of Stratus Horizon Pro, then enable the **Turn on When Plugged In** switch.
